SCHOOL INFORMATION

- Our Lady of Lourdes Academy is an archdiocesan high school for young women in grades 9 through 12.
- The school was founded in 1963 to educate Cuban refugees that were under the care of the Catholic Welfare Bureau and is located on a 6-acre campus in suburban South Miami.
- Our student population is comprised of 96% Hispanic and 4% non-Hispanic students.
- Students matriculate from 44 schools and more than 21 Catholic parishes in Miami-Dade County.
- The school is staffed by the Sisters, Servants of the Immaculate Heart of Mary.
- Our faculty is made up of 79 dedicated professionals, 77% of our faculty hold advanced degrees.
- As a premier college preparatory high school in Miami-Dade County, the school has a highly selective admissions process.
- 28% of students receive financial assistance.

Our Lady of Lourdes Academy offers classes at a variety of levels, including:

- 45 College Prep courses
- 73 Honors courses
- 5 Advanced English Topics courses
- 3 Advanced Math Topics courses
