## SCHOOL INFORMATION

- Our Lady of Lourdes Academy is an archdiocesan high school for young women in grades 9 through 12.
- The school was founded in 1963and is located on a 6-acre campus in suburban South Miami.
- Students matriculate from 44 schools and more than 21 Catholic parishes in Miami-Dade County.
- The school is staffed by the Sisters, Servants of the Immaculate Heart of Mary.
- The teaching faculty consists of 64 members (including two religious), with 77% holding advanced degrees.

## THE BERNADETTE SCHOLARS PROGRAM

- The Bernadette Scholars Program began in 2011.
- The program is designed for highly motivated and intellectually gifted students to excel in academics.
- Students take the most challenging curriculum and participate in cultural and extracurricular enrichment opportunities.

# ACADEMICS

Our Lady of Lourdes Academy offers classes at a variety of levels, including:

- 50 College Prep courses
- 68 Honors courses
- 2 Advanced Topics courses
- 25 Advanced Placement (AP) courses
- 14 Dual Enrollment courses

NOTE: Prerequisite course grades limit access to advanced courses. Math curriculum sequence varies based on placement freshman year and is tracked thereafter.

# VIRTUAL LEARNING

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Our Lady of Lourdes Academy used a combination of 100% online learning and hybrid learning for the 2020-2021 school year. As of August 2021, Our Lady of Lourdes Academy employed 100% in-person learning.

#### AWARDS AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS 2019-2022

- Speech & Debate: One Academic All-American Award by the National Speech and Debate Association
- Yearbook: The school's yearbook (*Le Fleure*) earned two Gold Ratings from the Columbia Scholastic Press Association (CSPA) and First Place with Special Merit from the American Scholastic Press Association.
